flint stockton served gallantly at san jacinto and afterward moved northward intent on gathering stray cattle and

horses to start a ranch he meets johanna mckenna on a westward wagon train they marry and strike out on their own to build a family along the comanche trace the ancient comanche war trails their first son cole seems born to the gun it is a wild untamed lawless land in an era where every mother s son carries a gun and knows how to use it some are better than others and with the reputation come stories about those who bear the title gunfighter cole s travels put him in contact with ruthless savage men who are used to having their own way and taking what they want from hapless victims he is forced to defend himself and does so with fire in his soul out of necessity he becomes a lonely man drifting from town to town untrusting except to himself from child on the texas frontier to adulthood as a man behind the gun cole stockton searches for his destiny struggles with his direction in life and emerges as a gunfighter whose moral code makes him a man of justice

in the pre hispanic mesoamerican world histories and collections of ritual knowledge were often presented in the form of painted and folded books now known as codices and the knowledge itself was encoded into pictographs eight codices have survived from the mixtec peoples of ancient oaxaca mexico a part of one of them the codex zouche nuttall is the subject of this book as a group the mixtec codices contain the longest detailed histories and royal genealogies known for any indigenous people in the western hemisphere the codex zouche nuttall offers a unique window into how the mixtecs themselves viewed their social and political cosmos without the bias of western european interpretation at the same time however the complex calendrical information recorded in the zouche nuttall has made it resistant to historical chronological analysis thereby rendering its narrative obscure in this pathfinding work robert lloyd williams presents a methodology for reading the codex zouche nuttall that unlocks its essentially linear historical chronology recognizing that the codex is a combination of history in the european sense and the timelessness of myth in the native american sense he brings to vivid life the history of lord eight wind of suchixtlan ad 935 1027 a ruler with the attributes of both man and deity as well as other heroic oaxacan figures williams also provides context for the history of lord eight wind through essays dealing with mixtec ceremonial rites and social structure drawn from information in five surviving mixtec codices

the flint hills are america s last tallgrass prairie a green enclave set in the midst of the farmland of eastern kansas known as the home of the big beef steer these rugged hills have produced exemplary cowboys both the ranch and rodeo varieties whose hard work has given them plenty of material for equally good stories jim hoy grew up in the flint hills on a ranch at cassoday that s been in his family for five generations and boasts roots as deep as those of bluestem grass in black soil bottomland he now draws on this area s rich cowboy lore as well as on his own experience working cattle breaking horses and rodeoing to write a folk history of the flint hills spanning a century and a half hoy blends history folklore and memoir to conjure for readers the tallgrass prairies of his boyhood in a book that richly recalls the ranching life and the people who lived it here are cowboys and outlaws rodeo stars and runaway horses ordinary folks and the stuff of legends hoy introduces readers to the likes of lou hart a top hand with the crocker brothers from 1906 to 1910 whose poetic paeon to ranch life circulated orally for fifty years before seeing print and he tracks down the legend of bud gillette considered by his neighbors the world s fastest man until he fell in with an unscrupulous promoter he even unravels the mystery of a lone grave supposed to be that of the first cowboy in the flint hills hoy also explains why a good horse makes up for having to work with exasperating cattle and why not all horses are created or trained equal and he traces flint hills cattle culture from the days of the trail drive through the railroad years to today s trucking era with most railroad stockyards torn down and only one section house left standing writes hoy i feed on the stories of the hills and the characters who tell them as the cattle

feed on the grasses his love of the land shines throughout a book so real that readers will swear they hear the click of horseshoes on flint rock with every turn of the page

this book provides full page biographies of men prominent in michigan s business professional political educational and cultural life in the late nineteenth century although the entries are not in alphabetical order there is an alphabetical index on pp xi xiv the entries are preceded by an extensive selection of historical background materials under such headings as the civil commonwealth the military record educational material interests religious organizations and miscellaneous which discusses the political parties liquor traffic including prohibition laws and also provides tables the religion section includes information about church doctrine and polity for mainline denominations and the educational section summarizes major institutional issues and conflicts at the university of michigan
